Farrier Dean Johanningmeier and Dr. Jacob Goodin will lead an equine podiatry clinic at the Morrie Waud Equine Clinic in Delavan, Wisconsin. Using local horses, Dean will address modern shoeing techniques that can affect movement and performance issues. He will explain that when horse is out of balance it may pick up the wrong lead or break a gait. The horse may also develop soreness issues that mimic joint lameness.

Johanningmeier will also show how corrective shoeing can help prevent lameness and provide long-term health. Dr. Goodin will address the benefits of working with your veterinarian and farrier while examining lameness and other hoof health issues. There is a discount for registering in advance.
